UUFBR Request: Main Presenter Sandy Troiano

Grant Amount Requested: \$20,000²

The UUFBR has two primary capital projects it must accomplish before the UUFBR reopens.

1. <u>Burial of power lines</u>: The trash hauler has discontinued its services because the power lines are too low, and its trucks cannot get to the dumpster. The Board has contacted all haulers serving the City of Boca Raton, with the same results.

After consideration of options to resolve this problems, the Board ahs determined that burial of the power lines is the best option. The Board has received three bids, with a low of \$10,930 and a high of \$37,126. Additional unknown costs are FPL fees and City of Boca Raton permit fees. Although the Board has asked FPL for estimated costs, FPL has not responded. It is estimated that the FPL cost will be around \$3,500.

Contractor Mark Giarrizzo explained that the low bid of \$10,930 did not include replacement of disconnects. When this is included in his bid, the cost is approximately \$21,000.

The Board will send copies of the bids to the Committee.

2. <u>Fire Alarm System</u>. The City of Boca Raton has cited the UUFBR for failing to have a fire alarm system in the main building. There is an alarm system in the RE Building.

The Board has received oral bids ranging from \$15,000 - \$30,000.

Note: The UUFBR Board of Trustees requested a matching amount, but was not specific in what it was requesting.

Cat Shelter/Feral Cats: Main Presenter: Bett Willett

Grant Amount Requested: \$4,000

Bett explained that Nicole is feeding and caring for a colony of about 30 feral cats. This includes setting up and, as necessary, paying for sterilization and microchipping.

Currently, Nicole does not have a corporate structure, and is not a non-profit entity. She intends to form such an entity so that she can apply for grant funds from other entities.

Bett asked for \$4,000 as she believed this was a good start up amount.

Broadway Dance Academy: Main Presenter Debra Weiss

Grant Amount Requested: \$1,800

Debra has previously requested and received funds from the Endowment, for the ongoing support of the Dance Academy. This Academy works in conjunction with DISC, to offer dance activities to children in the Pearl City area. This year, she is asking for \$1,800 to fund the creation of a series of free Broadway Dance Family Day programs at the new Allen's Place Memorial Garden in Pearl City.

At the conclusion of the presentations, the meeting recessed at 2:19 PM, prior to going into closed session for discussion of grant awards.
