#### **Sunday Services**

#### Share-The-Plate seeking suggestions and members!

In December 2006, we began sharing our Sunday Collection Plate with the wider community in a **Share-The-Plate** program. After starting this program, contributions to the plate doubled. Half of each collection helps to pay the bills at UUFBR, and the other half goes to the Share-the-Plate Fund. When the Fund reaches \$1000, that \$1000 is given to a nonprofit organization.

All recipients of this program are nonprofits suggested by UUFBR members; often these are active participants with the particular organization.

In 2022, we shared the plate with All People's Day, the American Red Cross, Aid to Victims of Domestic Abuse (AVDA), Emergency Medical Assistance (EMA), Florida League of Women Voters Education Fund, Boca Helping Hands and Propel. This year we have given to P.E.A.C.E. (People Engaged in Active Community Efforts), Safe Harbor Center and we are currently collecting for Inspiring Connections Outdoors, a program of the Sierra Club which helps urban youth get out into nature.

It is important to note that the ministries and work of UUFBR are primarily funded through annual pledges made by our members and pledging friends. We conduct a oncea-year pledge drive in the winter and this year our members and friends committed to giving \$157,775 to UUFBR. The total income budgeted for this year (April – March) is \$245,150.

There's a picture I like that illustrates the importance of context. First we see a dove sitting on her nest, the very picture of peace – and then the frame widens to show the plunging waterfall nearby. The picture shows that peace is not the absence of noise and confusion, but the ability to focus on what's important.

To understand not just what decisions your board has been making, but the context in which those decisions arise, here are some recent actions and their context:

\* \* \* \* \* \* \* \*

**Actions:** Your Board is working on both transitional work (mission and vision, types of ministry, bylaws) and congregational development (regular Congregational Conversations, monthly leadership development sessions, an upcoming Board Retreat).

**Context:** It's only been a year since many aspects of life at UUFBR changed drastically. As a newly "independent" congregation, we are still in a learning curve: we are still setting up systems and new working relationships.

\* \* \* \* \* \* \* \*

**Actions:** We stepped back from the settled ministry search for this cycle and will be choosing a different type of ministry for the coming year. The Board will make the decision after getting congregational input: **don't miss the July 23 Congregational Conversation on this topic.** 

**Context:** A settled minister search requires a huge investment of time, talent and treasure, and we have other priorities that need to be addressed first: we need to clarify who we are and what we want before we can offer ourselves as a partner in a new shared ministry.

\* \* \* \* \* \* \* \*

Actions: Your VP of Facilities has been maintaining, monitoring and improving your Fellowship. We're holding our cleaning service accountable for sub-par performance, installing security bars on playground gates, getting bids for a new fire alarm, and working on security measures and safety policies that will protect us and our Sharex partners. Don't miss the Congregational Conversation on Safety and Security on July 2.

**Context:** We are still coping with the effects of our long absence during the pandemic, as well as supporting our Sharex partners.

\* \* \* \* \* \* \* \*

Actions: We are training the new bookkeeping service, trying to streamline and reduce our expenses. At the same time the Tiltons are successfully raising income by bringing in and supporting Sharex partners. In addition, the task force that has been pursuing a conditional use permit is trying to find the best way forward in the face of obstacles and uncertainty.

**Context:** We are trying to achieve a healthy ratio of income to expenses, and a balance between pledge income and supplementary income. We're also trying to find a balance between sharing expenses with outside partners and prioritizing our own use of our facilities. And all our efforts to achieve financial solvency must be in service to our mission and our values.

\* \* \* \* \* \* \*

Actions: The Program leaders debriefed about the program year and started coordinating for our Fall 2023 Program Fair. The Board approved (subject to sufficient funding) a Membership proposal to hire a marketing and social media consultant to increase our reach, and the formation of a music search team to recruit an interim music director. The Community Services Committee filled the vacancy caused by Seyril Siegel's death. The Memorial Garden Team is revising and updating our brochure and policies about the services we offer on the death of a member or friend of UUFBR.

**Context:** We can only attract people to join our community if they know about us and what we offer. Internal communication, efficient systems, and shared practices are essential. So is external marketing, to show the world who we are and what we offer.

Together, we help each other recognize the context behind our actions and remember what's important. That's where true peace can be found.

#### The Power of Story Cont.

When it came time for the first performance, I decided to attend. I was curious and wanted to support Anthony. As I sat in the back row, waiting for the show to begin, I observed the parents of the fledgling actors as they filed into the sanctuary. It made me think about my own parenting days filled with similar activities. As I watched, I realized these parents could be my children and the children on stage, my grandchildren. And it hit me, what a different experience these parents must be having from my own. Unlike me, these parents have been raising their children under the duress of pandemic times, facing an uncertain future with climate change, coping with a sharp rise in the cost of living, and fearing the escalating violence in our society that threatens the safety of their children who would be forever marked by these conditions. It seemed to me this current generation of children stood to lose their innocence too quickly which could disrupt their sense of meaning and value in life.

But then as I watched these grade school kids perform, reciting their lines and belting out songs, my worry receded. Two thoughts came to me: first, The Lion King represents a timeless story of good vs. evil, hope vs. despair, love vs. fear, and courage in the face of uncertainty. It is a classic tale that instructs us that with life comes change, sometimes big change that causes suffering. But life is also full of great joy and in a larger sense endures through the generations. My second thought was that these children were not passively watching this story in the form of a Disney animation, but rather they were embodying what the story has to teach – that life, no matter how challenging, is worth living and living well – and because they embodied these values, these children would not forget them. This theater camp was building anchor points for these kids that would equip them for what lies ahead. These thoughts filled me with hope.

I think Anthony Huber is doing very important work. I encourage you to support his efforts by attending a performance in July. There is an afternoon and an evening performance, Thursday through Saturday. You can check out the schedule which appears in the weekly Eblasts.

I also want to recognize that Hubert Arts is a Sharex Partner that embodies the Sharex goals of providing space for non-profits doing good works or groups that provide life-saving services to people who need the support of a caring community. Betty and John Tilton do a super job of managing Sharex partners – be sure to thank them when you see them. They are the ones who bring in meaningful partnerships that help build beloved community within our walls.






