

Upcoming Congregational Conversations

As leaders, the trustees of the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Boca Raton hold space for important discussions within the framework of the covenant we affirm every week in our worship services.

This covenant calls us to seek the truth in love. What does love look like in this context? It looks like mutual respect. Taking turns speaking. Listening to understand, not to reload. Using active listening to reflect back and clarify what was heard to make sure that was what was intended. Calling each other back into covenant when we stray.

Some of our members are concerned about one of the votes that will be held at this year's General Assembly of the Unitarian Universalist Association in June. A group has formed to conduct discussions in favor of a particular position. To ensure a healthy process, which is part of the necessary growth during this transitional time between permanent ministers, the trustees are creating a pathway that embodies our covenant, creating context, exchanging information, and holding dialogue.

Here is the context for this process:

- 1. How does the UUA create change at the associational level through voting at General Assembly?
- 2. What was the path to the current proposed change in the UUA bylaws?
- 3. What are the grounds for concern in that process?
- 4. What is there for us to discern both as an independent congregation and as a member of the Association of UU congregations?
- 5. How do we want to express our communal response at the associational level?
- 6. What is our relationship with our GA delegates?

We will hold listening sessions both in person and on Zoom that will address the questions raised. We anticipate starting the process in early February, and continuing until we are ready for a congregational vote, whether that takes place in March, April or May (our only deadline is General Assembly, which takes place June 20-23 and this year will be held entirely on Zoom).

It's a big investment, given how full our UUFBR calendar is with other important congregational priorities. We are committed to a healthy process, which will produce both a deeper understanding of each other and a covenant-rooted decision. All are invited to step into the space of dialogue and discernment as we seek the truth in love.

Notes of Universal connection



We all have heard, to a greater or lesser degree, the expression: "Music is a Universal language", but, what does this mean?

Let's bring it down to the most literal definition of the word "language".

Music is that magical force that can make a Spanish pianist, a South Korean flutist, a German clarinetist and a Russian violinist communicate without words. Really picture this: imagine a Spanish pianist playing the keys, a South Korean flutist breathing life into delicate notes, a German clarinetist,

shaping the music with every breath, and a Russian violinist, evoking soul-stirring melodies; all having a conversation. Not a single word is exchanged, yet it forms this beautiful language that bridges differences. Spoken words are not needed, because the sounds of our instruments and the feelings of our hearts are enough. More than enough, I dare say.

And the wonders keep occurring when music is performed for an audience: it becomes a shared experience. Music turns a concert hall or an intimate gathering into a space where we synchronize with the rhythm. It's like our heartbeats align with the music's beat, creating a deep connection regardless of our backgrounds or musical knowledge. Being alive is all you need to be able to understand the music you listen to. Because music is a language that doesn't speak to our brains, but to our hearts.

Music also speaks to our feeling of belonging. We have national anthems, we play music at parties and events, we have themed music for each time of the year! Soundtracks are everywhere. Here in the UU community we have two great hymnals filled with gorgeous music, that serve as a testament to the power of music in expressing shared values and beliefs. Every Sunday, our Chalice Choir along with the members of the congregation, join their voices together and share that experience that goes beyond the music.

Music isn't just about sounds; it's this language that brings us all together. It's this magic that breaks through language barriers, and makes us feel like we're part of something bigger. In a world where words and borders can divide us, music stands tall as this powerful language of unity—a melody that speaks straight to the heart.

Faithful Foundations Fitness Challenge: An Exercise in Seeing Abundance in What We Have

This exercise did not involve jumping jacks or a workout. The "fitness" challenge was to identify the physical spaces, the programs, and the people which, by themselves, represent assets or attractive qualities of the Fellowship. Folks were asked to write as many positive attributes as they could think of, one per half sheet of paper, and then arrange the papers on the floor where they could all be seen at once. Here is a sampling of assets identified:

Central location, wonderful neighborhood, sanctuary with glass walls & seating for 200, Labyrinth, Memorial Garden, AV tech & equipment, hybrid worship, patio, music, Saint Andrews road frontage, trees, Florida native landscape, abundant outdoor spaces, ample and well-lit parking, additional building, classrooms, artistic & gifted people, welcoming, humility, compassion, sharing ideas, friends love, empathy, kindness, open hearts & minds, a place to belong, ceremonies, piano, humor, jokesters, game-night fun, camaraderie, listening, music, choir, vision, tolerance, storytellers, abundant life-span religious education resources, central location library, mentors, role models, cooperation, willing hands, curiosity, and much, much more.

At first, patterns were challenging to see but as soon as a connection was made between people's gifts and physical spaces, ideas flowed for potential projects, events, and programs. Here is a sampling of what emerged from the connections made by participants:

<u>Idea for Event, Project, or Program</u>	People, Attributes, and Assets
Banned Book Lending Library	Central location, wonderful neighborhood, abundant life-span religious education resources, central location, library, storytellers.
Adult Art Class	Trees, landscape, gifted people, classrooms, sharing ideas, vision, cooperation.
Compassion Café	Compassion, friends, camaraderie, humility, kindness, welcome, empathy, harmony, communication.
Ceremonies Affirming Love of All Kinds	Sanctuary with glass walls, a place to belong, gather in love, open hearts and minds, ceremonies.
Coffee House	Listening, music, jokester, piano, choir artistic and gifted people, game-night fun, storytellers.

Faithful Foundations Fitness Challenge: An Exercise in Seeing Abundance in What We Have continued

Through this exercise, members could see how our congregational life might be enhanced and enlarged by simply matching people's gifts with existing physical spaces, attributes, and resources.

In the last step of the Faithful Foundations Fitness Challenge, folks voted with their feet by ranking their preferences for the above-named programming. The top two are the last two listed: **Coffee House won the day with Ceremonies a close second.** The ideas more specifically are for a recurring Coffee House music and talent show, and Ceremonies includes Renaming Ceremonies for Transgender folk. The upshot of this "fitness" challenge is realizing what abundance exists in what this Fellowship already has at hand to serve us now and to make room for more to join us in the future. May we see the beauty and the plenty of this beloved community that is UUFBR.


