## October Worship Service Schedule

#### October 6 - Forgiveness Across Faiths

Ron Roth and Robyn Stuart led a service focused on forgiveness and the renewal of community through love, aligning with the spirit of Yom Kippur, the holiest day in the Jewish calendar. Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, is a time when Jewish people reflect on past mistakes, seek forgiveness, and strive for a fresh start. The concept of forgiveness is interpreted in many ways across cultures and religions. Most world religions include teachings on forgiveness and mercy, forming the foundation for many of today's modern traditions and practices around healing justice.

#### October 13- Ayudha Puja: Venerating the Tools of Our Trades

This Sunday we observe the Hindu holiday of Ayudha Puja. It is a day for expressing gratitude, and even reverence, for the tools that help us to live our lives. We honor the wisdom in this tradition by considering the tools and the technology that are woven into and ubiquitous in the way we live today. How does our relationship with all these machines affect our spirits as well as our material well-being?

After viability, if abortion is necessary to protect the woman's health, that decision is between the woman and her medical care provider. 

#### Meditation on Breathing: Connecting Music, Breath and Healing

Hymn #1009 Meditation on Breathing, in Singing the Journey is our current Congregational Response after the Sharing of Concerns and Sorrows. This simple chant, written by Sarah Dan Jones after 9/11, offers a way for our congregation to center ourselves after we express personal and collective grief. The refrain—"When I breathe in, I'll breathe in peace. When I breathe out, I'll breathe out love"—invites us into a calming practice and can become a source of comfort and healing.

The beauty of this hymn lies in how it brings together music, meditation, and breath. In meditation practices, focusing on the breath helps us center ourselves and stay grounded and



present in the moment. This hymn uses the rhythm of breath to transform singing into a meditative practice. As we repeat the chant, the act of breathing in peace and breathing out love helps us slow down and focus, creating a peaceful moment of mindfulness. It's simple, but its effect on the mind and body can be profound.

Singing Meditation on Breathing as a congregation adds another layer to this experience. While each person connects with their breath and finds peace in the music, the act of singing together strengthens our bond as a community. After the Sharing of Concerns and Sorrows, this communal singing allows us to come together, hold each other in a space of compassion, and create a collective sense of healing. The simplicity of the chant makes it easy for everyone to join in, allowing us to feel united in the shared rhythm of our breath and song.

The connection between music and breath is powerful, and this hymn embodies that beautifully. By combining simple lyrics with mindful breathing, it helps us tap into a deeper sense of calm and awareness. Whether we're singing it during a service or using it in personal reflection, it offers a space for healing and connection.

As we breathe together, we are reminded of the power of shared mindfulness. Each breath becomes a moment of intention, allowing us to find peace within ourselves and radiate love to those around us. In a world that often feels fast and chaotic, Meditation on Breathing offers a gentle reminder to slow down, breathe deeply, and be present for ourselves and our community. It's a gift that keeps giving, allowing us to find moments of calm and connection wherever we are.

Join the congregation in singing this hymn during our Sunday services and experience it for yourself.
